Real Life Community Outreach is one of the newest nonprofits working in the San Antonio area, but we've already made a big impact. Our regional food pantry serves over 60,000 individuals per year distributing over \$2 million in essential food supplies. Vocational Training Institute elevated the earning power of 60 people through skill training and certification. During the summer, we invested in two underresourced neighborhoods bringing kids camps to 136 youth.

We're starting this new fiscal year excited to broaden our partnerships with businesses, foundations, and individuals who want to join us in increasing compassion to our community. For example, Cummins Diesel brought a team to serve at our food pantry and entered a team to play at our Real Life Charity Golf

Tournament. Partnering together, we can make a difference.







Juan's Story



"I'm a Cuban immigrant; I fled to the United States. I found it very difficult at first to find a job even though I had been educated in my country. Pastor Yoan recommended the HVAC course at Real Life VTI. I entered school in that same month where I received theoretical and practical studies of high quality and very contextualized with all the environmental and technical standards that govern the Air Conditioning and Heating systems in the United States. This acquired knowledge quickly

opened the doors for me to work in a company for about 5 months where I could verify the knowledge I was acquiring. After this period, we decided to join with another graduate of Real Life VTI and we formed a company with the name JAY Intel AC where, with the favor of God, we are forging a space in the market in San Antonio, Texas."
